Edison High School – Director of Choirs and Vocal Music

- Collaborated with world-renowned artists—including Voces8, the Westminster Choir, Donald Nally, Eric Whitacre, and Reena Esmail—and prepared performances at Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center, providing students with mentorship and exposure to premier professional experiences.
- Planned and led annual overnight competition trips for 100 students to locations including Virginia Beach, Disney, Universal, and Myrtle Beach, coordinating travel logistics and recreational activities that culminated in fulfilling musical experiences with choirs earning first-place, Superior, and Best in Class awards at all four locations.
- Served as Chief Executive Officer of the Edison High School Choir Parents Organization, directing all parent fundraising efforts and initiatives totaling over \$700K across five years, including planning, budgeting, and execution of major trips, festivals, and musical programs.
- Created and conducted the Edison Township Choral Festival, uniting 300 students, alumni, and community members from rival high schools (Edison High School and John P. Stevens High School) into a single choral ensemble.

- Instructed 3 orchestra classes (Freshmen Orchestra, Concert Orchestra, and Auditioned Chamber Orchestra), all while handling Director of Choirs and Vocal Music responsibilities.
- Conducted diverse repertoire for performances and collaborated with Wind Ensemble Colleagues and students to perform symphonic orchestral pieces.
- Managed logistical aspects of the orchestra program, including scheduling rehearsals, organizing concerts, and coordinating with faculty and staff, while maintaining communication with parents and guardians.
- Mentored student leaders within the orchestra, fostering leadership and musical skills.
